Chair Stewart called the meeting to order at 3:30 pm on February 3, 2022.

The February 2022, Agenda was approved as submitted. After introductions, the minutes from the December 2021 meeting were approved as submitted.

Cardinal-Hickory 345kV transmission line between Dubuque and Clayton County

A judge ruled that the environmental review did not follow the guidelines it was supposed to. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act states that Federal agencies must take into account the affects of its actions on historic properties. While this separate from the environmental review of the transmission line project, Clayton County and Dubuque County Historic Preservation Commissions, along with tribal entities, the State Historic Preservation Office and the state archeologist are being invited to re-submit any comments or concerns they have regarding the programmatic agreement as it concerns historic preservation.

FY 2022 (1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022) budget allocation approved for \$900. DCHPC has offered to sponsor an exhibit titled "Toward Universal Suffrage". Stewart has reached out to the Dyersville Library and S. Larson has communicated with the U of Dubuque, but neither has been committed to dates as of this time. Since that time, Loras College has expressed an interest to Iowa State, where the exhibit comes from, in hosting the exhibit, so Stewart invited Brian Hallstoos from the University of Dubuque and Heidi Pruitt from Loras College to this meeting to discuss what dates the exhibit should come. Loras has signed up for October 3 - 17, 2022. The Commission would like the display to be back to back, so it get delivered to one school, then goes to the second school, then goes back to Iowa State, so UD just has to decide whether they want the dates before or after Loras's dates. One panel is 3 feet wide by 7 feet tall; four panels are 10 feet wide by 7 feet tall. They all collapse for transport. All five panels have content on both sides. Approximately 600 square feet is required to set up the exhibit. Loras plans to display the exhibit in their library. UD will display the exhibit in their multicultural center.

Commissioners are preparing four presentations on various topics (Mary Goebel, Patricia J. Baum , Sandra M. Larson and David Vanderah). Goebel had no updates on Ballrooms and bands. Vanderah has interviewed Scott Henderson of the Henderson house on Main Street.

It is time to work on DCHPC's budget request for fiscal year 2022. This will mostly be based on previous year's budgets on \$900. The presentation will be sent to Commissioners for final review before sending to the Board of Supervisor.

There was an article in the Telegraph Herald about a former hotel building in Dyersville.

The next meeting of DCHPC will be on Thursday 7 April 2022. Dubuque County Historical Society (DCHS) joins with DCHPC to present Historic Preservation Awards. The next Historic Preservation Award meetings will be on March 9th and April 6th. Architecture Days will be May 2 to 7th.
